ready access to information on measurement instruments (i.e., questionnaires, interview

techniques, vignettes/scenarios, tests) in the health fields, psychosocial sciences,
organizational behavior, and library and information science.

present. The Mental Measurements Yearbook, from the Buros
Institute, contains descriptive information and critical reviews
of more than 2,000 commercially-available standardized
English-language educational, personality, aptitude,
neuropsychological, achievement and intelligence tests. Each
entry includes test name and classification; author(s); publisher,
publication date; price; time requirements; existence of validity
and reliability data; score descriptions; levels; and intended populations.

ProQuest Digital Dissertations (ProQuest) Covers: 1861-present. Types of Formerly known as
Dissertations Abstracts International. Contains 1.6 million citations for dissertations and
theses from over 1,000 graduate schools. Provides indexing back to 1861 and full-text
availability to titles back to 1997 (full-text availability varies by author's institution).
