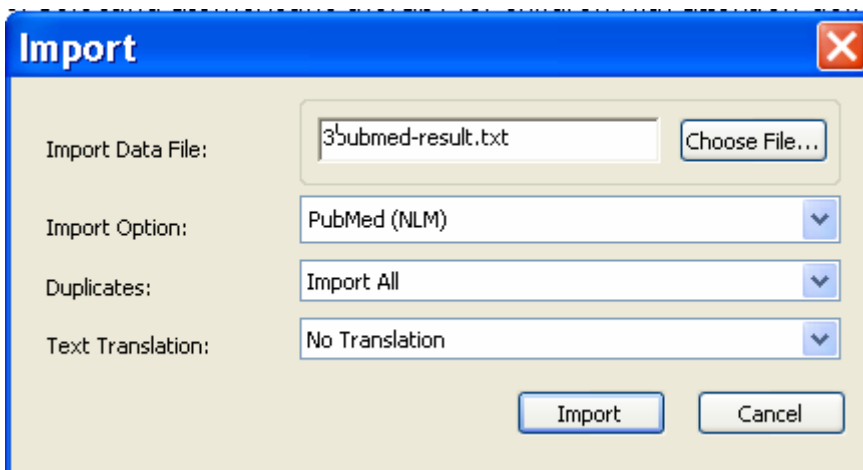


## Importing References From PubMed into EndNote v9

1. Perform your search in PubMed ([www.pubmed.gov](http://www.pubmed.gov)) and view and select the records you want to bring into your citation management software.
2. After selecting your records, from the pull down menu beside **Display**, select **MEDLINE**.
3. From the pull down menu beside **Send To:** select **File**.
4. A **File Download** dialog box will appear. Choose **Save**. (If you don't see the dialog box, make sure your pop-up blocker is not turned on for this site.)
5. A **Save As:** dialog box will appear. In the **Save in:** box choose where you wish to save the file. Change the **File** name to something you will recognize. The file name should end with **.txt** (Type=text Document). Click on **Save**.
6. In EndNote, locate the EndNote library you wish to transfer your records to and open it.
7. In EndNote, select **File**, then **Import...** An Import dialog box will appear.



Use **Choose file...** to browse for the file you just saved from PubMed.

In **Import Option** use the dropdown box and select PubMed (NLM).

**Duplicates:** Decide whether to import duplicates, and make sure the appropriate drop-down option is selected.

**Text translation** is an advanced option dealing with languages other than English—not a problem with PubMed.

8. Click on the **Import** button. Your references will now be transferred into your EndNote Library.
9. You'll only see the imported references. Take a look at the imported citations to make sure that they imported correctly. To toggle to all references in the library, type Ctrl-M, or go to the **References > Show All References**.
