Two Styles of Documentation (section 16.1)

Notes and bibliography style (section 16.3): references to works are given within the text as notes, either endnotes (section 16.21, 16.22) or footnotes (section 16.23, 16.24) and supplemented by a bibliography.

Author-date or parenthetical style (section 16.4): references to works are given within the text as author's last name and publication date, enclosed in parentheses. For example: (Blinksworth 1987)
